LCDR Jackson is a native of Atlanta, Georgia. After high school graduation and two years of college level studies, he enlisted into the United States Marine Corps in June, 1988. After boot camp, Chaplain Jackson was assigned to Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron (MALS) 14, located at Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Cherry Point, NC. He transferred from Cherry Point in February 1992, to MCAS Beaufort, SC., where he stayed until his EAS out of the Marine Corps in October 1995.
