## CDR WARREN D. JUDGE United States Coast Guard

CDR Judge has 27 years of distinguished service in the United States Coast Guard (USCG), with occupational specialty in the area of C4IT (Command, Control, Computers and Communications). Commander (CDR) Warren D. Judge is currently stationed at the Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, DC and is a Technical Director and Leads Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance, & Reconnaissance (C4ISR) design/implementation projects & acquisition strategies for National Security Cutters, Offshore Patrol Cutters, Fast Response Cutters, Maritime Patrol Aircraft; manages cost, schedule, and performance. Manages a budget of \$30M and leads a matrix team of over 80 personnel from Coast Guard-wide C4ISR and Logistics in the execution of acquisitions; he is also the Information Assurance Manager, responsible for preparation/quality of required security certifications and Configuration Manager.

CDR Judge previous unit was the White House Communications Agency (WHCA) from May 2009 to August 2012. CDR Judge was a Presidential Response Officer - Executive Tier One communications lead for the President of the United States (POTUS) and the executive senior staff. CDR Judge was the only Coast Guardsman at the 950 joint military personnel unit and was hand picked as one of seven personnel within WHCA who traveled on board Air Force One, Marine Two and to Camp David as a WHCA Command Representative, overseeing communications. CDR Judge also traveled as a Presidential Communications Officer where he deployed in advance on short notice anywhere in the world to provide instantaneous secure/non-secure voice communications and five-minute recorded message traffic to POTUS, Vice-President, National Security Council, and the United States Secret Service. His responsibilities also included facilitating the safe, on-time shipping, receiving, set up, and breakdown of greater than 50,000 pounds of executive communications equipment valued at greater than \$1.5M to domestic and international locations. While serving in this capacity, he traveled around the world to locations such as Moscow, Russia; Shanghai, China; Seoul, South Korea; Dublin, Ireland, and many other domestic and international locations.

In January 2009 CDR Judge was one of four Military Assistants from the USCG to support the Armed Forces Inaugural Committee, which served during the 56<sup>th</sup> Inauguration of the United States where Barack Obama was sworn in as the nation's 44<sup>th</sup> President. His previous experience includes serving the Career Management Branch Chief for the Coast Guard Officer of Personnel Management, where he provided dedicated career management advice to more than 8,000 officers. CDR Judge interacted with officers, command and program managers to enhance the level of understanding regarding officer career opportunities; he reached out to over 1,800 military personnel per year enhancing their competitiveness. CDR Judge was the Operations Officer, Electronic Systems Support Unit New Orleans, LA where he worked following Hurricane Katrina leading teams to rebuilding the Coast Guard's lower gulf coast command and control infrastructure and assisted in saving more than 34,000 lives; Assistant Operations Officer and Law Enforcement Officer, Coast Guard Group Mobile, AL; Software Developer, Command Control and Engineering Center, Portsmouth, VA. CDR Judge is a highly decorated officer honored to have served as a former member of the Commandant's Leadership Advisory Council (2004-08) and has greater than 35 medals, honors and commendations to his credit, to include the Department of Defense's and Coast Guard's Meritorious Service Medal.

With a consummate goal to pursue his professional best, CDR Judge has achieved a stellar list of military and civilian educational accomplishments including being named as one of the Modern Day Technology Leaders for the Coast Guard at the 2013 and 2014 Black Engineer of the Year award celebration, and received the 2013 Elizabeth City State University Chancellor's Legacy Leadership award for the military. His military education includes Search and Rescue Training, and Command Intelligence Course. Moreover, he completed his Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Science at Elizabeth City State University in Elizabeth City, NC in 1997 where he earned the distinguished Ronald E. McNair Scholarship; completed Officer Candidate School in Yorktown, VA in 1997; earned his first Master of Science degree in Computer Science from historic Howard University in 2004; earned a second Master of Science degree in System Quality Management (Six Sigma emphasis) from the National Graduate School in Falmouth, MA in 2007, and completed Officer Personnel Management Leadership Potential Seminar in Sheperdstown, WV in 2008.
