Ensign Rodger's Bio

Ensign Rogers enlisted in the Navy in November1992. Upon completion of Recruit Training and ATD in Orlando FL, she was assigned to NAS Adak, Alaska. In February 1995, she attended Hospital Corpsman "A" school in San Diego, Ca. Upon completion of "A" school, she was assigned to Naval Hospital Millington, TN in June of the same year. In 1997she transferred to US Naval Hospital Naples Italy. In April 2000 she attended Physical Therapy "C" school. She completed the first phase in San Antonio, TX and the second in Bethesda, MD. In November 2000 she transferred to Naval Hospital Charleston, SC. In July of 2003 she was assigned to Marine Corps Recruit Depot in Parris Island, SC. She served as the Leading Petty Officer of the Physical Therapy Department. In 2006 her next assignment was to the USS George Washington (CVN- 73) Norfolk, Virginia, which subsequently changed homeport to Yokosuka, Japan in 2008. During this tour she advanced to Petty Officer First Class, became the Leading Petty Officer of Medical Division, Health Services Department and completed two qualifications; Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist and Enlisted Aviation Warfare Specialist. In 2009, Ensign Rogers submitted a package for the Medical Enlisted Commissioning Program (MECP), and was accepted. In 2010 she started in the fall of Jacksonville University toward her degree in Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BSN). She was commissioned as a nurse corps ensign on 3 May 2013. Her personal awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (four), Navy Good Conduct Medal (six), Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (one) GWOT service medal (one) and various unit and campaign awards.
