 - **Washington Monument** (Constitution Avenue and 15th Street, NW.)
 - **DC War Memorial** (National Mall, west of 17th St. and Independence Ave. SW.)
 - **Eisenhower Memorial** (Between 4th and 6th Streets SW)
 - **Franklin D Roosevelt Memorial** (West Potomac Park near Lincoln Memorial on Ohio Drive, SW)
 - **Jefferson Memorial** (15th Street, SW)
 - **Korean War Veterans Memorial** (Daniel French Drive and Independence Avenue, SW)
 - **George Mason Memorial** (900 Ohio Drive, in East Potomac Park, SW.)
 - **Iwo Jima Memorial** (Marshall Drive, next to Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia)
 - **Lyndon Baines Johnson Memorial Grove** (George Washington Parkway, Washington DC.)
 - **Martin Luther King Jr. National Memorial** (Tidal Basin, Washington, DC.)
 - **National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial** (Judiciary Square at E Street, NW, between 4th and 5th Streets)
 - **Pentagon Memorial** (I-395 at Boundary Channel Drive, Washington DC.)
 - **Theodore Roosevelt Island** (George Washington Memorial Parkway, Washington, DC.)
 - **United States Air Force Memorial** (One Air Force Memorial Drive, Arlington, Virginia)
 - **U. S. Holocaust Memorial Museum** (100 Raoul Wallenberg Place, SW.)
 - **United States Navy Memorial** (at 701 Pennsylvania Ave. NW., between 7th and 9th Streets.)
 - **Vietnam Veterans Memorial** (Constitution Avenue and Henry Bacon Drive, NW)
 - **Women in Vietnam Memorial** (Constitution Avenue and Henry Bacon Drive, NW.)
 - **World War II Memorial** (17th Street, between Constitution and Independence Avenues.)
 - **George Washington National Masonic Memorial** (101 Callahan Drive | Alexandria, VA 22301)
4. Walk through Georgetown
5. Explore Mount Vernon
6. See a show or concert at Kennedy Center
7. Tour Old Town, Alexandria
8. See a concert at Wolftrap Farm Park (outdoors)
9. Tour the three houses of Government (US Capitol Building, White House and US Supreme Court)
10. * **Visit Frederick Douglass National Historic Site (Cedar Hill)** - Capitol Riverfront 1411 W St. SE, Washington, DC 20020
