HADWICK & LILY THOMPSON SCHOLARSHIP AWARD PRESENTATION

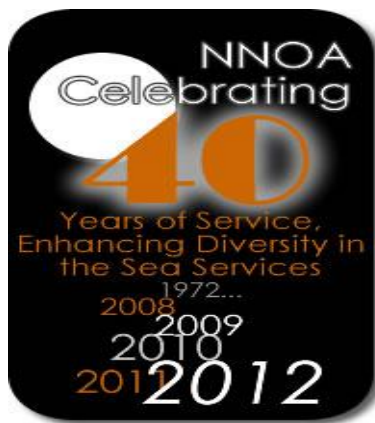
